

Foster Parent Qualifications/Steps to Licensure:

- 1. Must be 21 years of age or older: married, single, divorced, or living with a partner are acceptable. We are looking for stable and nurturing individuals to provide a structured home for abused/neglected children.
- 2. In good physical, mental and emotional health
- 3. You and any one over the age of 18 that is currently LIVING IN YOUR HOUSE must:
 - Pass a criminal background check which is \$39.50 per person.
 - Pass a central registry check to see if you are on the central registry for any kind of child abuse or neglect. This is \$35.00 per person/couple.
 - Compete or have completed CPR and First Aid.
 - Pass a home inspection to ensure a safe environment for children:
 - Each child must have their own bed. They cannot ever share a bed
 - Must have a door to the bedroom
 - Foster Children over the age of 4 may not share a room with the opposite sex unless siblings
- 4. Supplemental income is required: Stipend cannot be a primary source of income.
- A family must be able to demonstrate that they are financially stable without a foster care stipend.
 - Welfare payments are not considered earned income. Food stamps and Section 8 housing may be a concern.
- 5. Complete Maple Star Training pre-licensure requirements. Additionally, 20 hours of on-going training are required each year that you are licensed.
- 6. Have reliable transportation.
- 7. Have a demonstrated willingness to learn non-traditional parenting techniques and commitment to preserver with children placed in home!

The process to become a foster parent:

After an initial meeting with the foster care recruiter you will be given the Maple Star application paperwork to begin the process toward licensure!

- 1. Complete & submit a Maple Star application to become a family care provider
- 2. Complete a fingerprint-based criminal and child-abuse record check for each adult who will have regular contact with children placed in the foster family home
- 3. A Maple Star Home Study evaluator will meet with you over a small series of interviews, and complete a home study on your family.
- 4. The Maple Star Licensing Specialist will meet with family members and inspect the home using a Home Health and Safety Checklist
- 5. In order to be licensed with Maple Star, each prospective family care provider must complete an orientation program, involving 27 hours of training, as well as become CPR/First Aid certified.
